School Lunches

The price of school lunch is still **£1.70 per day**. The total cost for the **first half-term** (from Wednesday 5th September until Friday 20th October) is **£56.10**. For the **second half-term** (from Monday 30th October to Wednesday 20th December) is **£62.90**. The **total cost** of lunches for the autumn term is **£119**.

The easiest way to pay for lunches is on ParentPay. If you are unable to use this method of payment we also have

printable barcodes available for you to pay with cash at a PayPoint. Please ask in the school office. If you think your child may be eligible for Free School Meals based on the benefits you are receiving, please come in to the school office.

Enrichment Clubs

We are offering an exciting and diverse range of after school enrichment clubs for your child this term. Please look out for a letter next week with more information on the enrichment clubs on offer and how to apply.

Medicines in School

We are currently updating the medicines kept in school, such as asthma pumps and epi-pens. Please let us know if anything needs updating, or if you need to add something.

Re: Update of Assistant Headteacher Job Titles & Areas of Responsibility:

At the end of the summer term, following consultation with school senior leaders, Chair and Vice Chair of Governors and the new Headteacher, an interim leadership structure was approved. Four highly valued and experienced members of our existing staff team were appointed as Interim Assistant Headteachers. I am excited to share further detail on their responsibilities. I have every confidence that these staff, along with the existing members of the senior leadership team, will ensure continuation of quality first teaching is maintained and the vision and values of Clapham Manor are taken forward.

Ms Christofi – Assistant Head for Community and Pre-School Early Years

Ms Christofi will continue as Strategic Lead for our Community provisions, including Clapham Manor and Heathbrook Children Centres, The Spinney, Clapham Manor Nursery, Heathbrook Park and Little Hazels. She will work in partnership with Ms Allen and Ms Watroba to lead and develop our pre-school provisions. In addition to this work Ms Christofi will be responsible for ensuring the quality and sustainability of all school extended services including the breakfast, after school and holiday provision, after school enrichment activities, family and adult learning, as well as investigating and developing new initiatives and links that will further support our children and our wider community. She will take the lead for Natural Thinkers and Food Flagship projects and will work in partnership with Ms Allen and Ms How to support our Home-School Liaison relationships. She will become the Designated Safeguarding, lead working with Miss How to ensure our school meets its commitment to safeguarding our children.



Ms Allen – Assistant Head for Early Years and Key Stage One



Ms Allen will be continuing her role as Phase 1 Leader and is therefore responsible for teaching and learning across our three Nursery Sites and two Reception classes. She will be also be working in collaboration with Mr Pittard, (Phase 2 Leader), to ensure that our high standards of quality first teaching and learning are maintained and that every child is safe, happy and enjoying learning. Part of this role will include leading and managing the experienced, dedicated support staff team in Early Years and Key Stage One. Ms Allen will be working alongside Ms Christofi and Ms How to further develop relationships with Parents/Carers and strengthen our home/school link. Ms Allen will be holding termly Parent Forums and will resume her role as the main point of contact for the Friends (PTA). As Strategic Lead for Science across the school, Ms Allen is looking forward to supporting the science team to further develop science at Clapham Manor and help to inspire many budding young scientists of the future.

Ms Ross – Assistant Head for Achievement and Interventions

Ms Ross is responsible for ensuring the quality and impact of pupil premium provision and interventions across the school, working with all pupils to ensure they are fulfilling their potential and achieving well. Alongside this she will be mentoring students undertaking placements at the school and the new teachers who join Clapham Manor to enable sustained high standards of teaching and learning. Working in partnership with Ms How and Ms Anderson, Ms Ross will be strategically leading attendance and supporting this successful team in continuing to strengthen rates of attendance and punctuality. After 5 enthusiastic years of leading computing, she will now be joining the English subject team as their strategic lead and is looking forward to enriching provision in this area of learning.





Ms Mumby – Assistant Head for Key Stage Two

As strategic lead for Key Stage 2 Ms Mumby will continue her role as phase 4 leader and will work in partnership with phase 3 leader, Ms Turner, to ensure the welfare, progress and attainment of all pupils from years 3 to 6. Within this role she will be leading and managing the experienced support staff team, as well continuing her work developing the practice of teachers in the key stage. Following years of dedicated work as the maths subject coordinator, she is now strategically leading this area of learning and is excited about building on the already existing inspired mathematics provision at the school. In addition to this, she is now responsible for strategically leading the arts and the social, moral, spiritual and cultural development of pupils. Continuing the legacy of Mr Jobson’s renowned school productions, Ms Mumby is excited to also be

leading on whole school enrichment opportunities as well as education visits.


Healthy Schools London Bronze Award Certificate.
