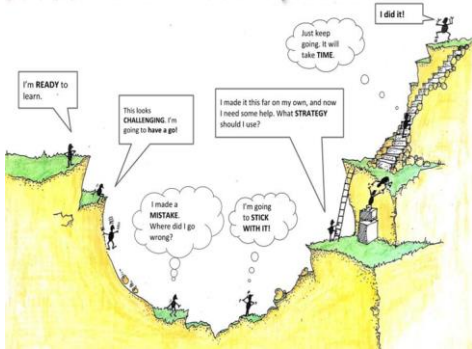

These form one part of the school curriculum and defines programmes of study for English, Mathematics, Science, Design and Technology, Computing, History, Geography, Art and Design, Languages [at Key Stage 2] Music and Physical Education, all of which are statutory. Our curriculum offer is inextricably linked to 'Growing Brighter Futures' where we champion and inspire our children's individuality, sense of belonging, independence and confidence by creating engaging, relevant and plentiful opportunities to learn. Environmental Education, Natural Thinkers, Food Technology, School Wide and Community Project offers across all year groups impacts positively on both readiness for learning, progress and attainment. We also include SRE [Sex and Relationships Education] in every year group along with comprehensive Personal, Social, Health, and Citizenship [PSHCE] and this year, Philosophy for Children [P4C] programmes to break down barriers and support children in Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural [SMSC] development. We have raised the profile of these areas and of Religious Education and Collective Worship to enhance pupils understanding of British Values, continuously developing our curriculum to meet the needs of our current pupils. Our design and coverage is intended to ensure that all of our pupils embed knowledge and develop skills making links across the curriculum. We rigorously monitor the delivery of our curriculum to ensure it impacts positively on attainment and progress for all children.
